## TREE TRIMMING

Please remember that it is the property owner's responsibility to trim or remove any trees or shrubs that are leaning into the alleyways, streets or sidewalks. This makes it difficult for traffic and is a safety issue. The city council is requiring all branches to have a distance of 12 feet from the ground surface allowing a clear space. You may place all trees trimmings at the Lakota Landfill free of charge. Cutting and trimming of this vegetation not completed in a timely manner, will force the city crew to go out and remove such hazard at the property owners expense. Some residents may have already received a letter requesting this to be completed, the deadline for trimming is October 15th, 2014.
