

Lakota Celebrates Arbor Day

The City of Lakota Tree Board recently celebrated Arbor Day by handing out trees to all elementary students at Lakota Elementary School on April 24, 2015. Each student was given a tree to plant in their yard or any allowed area of their choice, with parental approval. The Lakota Tree Board met with the Nelson County Soil Conservation to come up with the right tree to plant for Lakota and this year there was a variety of trees, such as Hackberry, Silver Maple, Red Maple and Popular Hybrid.

The Lakota Tree Board was established on April 5, 2010, which includes Norris Severtson, Dan Kassian, and Amie Vasichkek. The Lakota Tree Board is enthusiastic about increasing public awareness on the importance for trees in our city, by getting the City of Lakota to participate in a program sponsored by the Arbor Day Foundation called the Tree City USA program (TCUSA). With the help of the Arbor Day Foundation, the Lakota Tree Board has been a participant of the TCUSA program for 5 years. Participating in TCUSA represents a strong community commitment to management of our trees and other natural resources. The TCUSA program helps residents learn what they can do to make their community a better place in which to live.
