Starting April, 2015 LMU will add the additional day of the 5th to our utility customer's automatic deduction options. LMU will also continue deducting participating customer's utility bill on the 20th of every month. Pet information for Lakota


Did you know that in the City of Lakota, your dog or cat needs to be licensed yearly as per Lakota City Ordinance 13.0201? At the time of licensing, the city of Lakota requires from the pet owner proof of current vaccination for each pet. The cost of a yearly pet license is \$2.50/per spayed or neutered dog or cat or \$5.00 for each pet not spayed or neutered. If you have a dog or cat in your residence, please come to the City Hall during business hours to license your pet.

Pets are also to be kept on a leash at all times when not in the pet owners home. Lakota Ordinance 13.0206, allows for the Nelson County Sheriff or the city to impound any unrestrained dog or cat in an animal shelter at the owners expense and also could be subject to a fine. This action is to provide safety for Lakota residents and pets.

In 2009, the city council adopted Ordinance 13.0209 to limit the number of pets in a single family dwelling to no more than 3 dogs and 3 cats. Any person violating any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of an infraction and shall be punished with a fine of \$100 per occurrence.
