Lakota Water Break

On the evening of August 11th, the city of Lakota experienced a major water break that severed the water supply to the entire town. The city crew, staff, council and volunteers worked countless hours to activate the emergency water line that was established in 2008 with Tri-County Water District. Water supply was restored to Lakota on August 13th. Manager of Tri-County Water District, Mike Blessum will continue to assist Lakota in supplying clean, safe water until the Lakota main line can be repaired.

The city council is working to best serve the community by applying to the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) fund under Governor Burgum's emergency budget. If awarded, the total construction cost could be paid by this grant. The city council has hired Bolten and Menk Engineering to assist with determining the best solution to repair the breaks of the main water line coming into town. The city council will be meeting with the engineers at the next regular city council meeting on September 8th to discuss our options.

We would like to thank all volunteers, businesses and organizations that contributed to the efforts in assisting Lakota residents while without water. All your support did not go unnoticed and it was greatly appreciated!
